Needle	A sharp object used to sew two items together.
Thread	A long, thin strand of cotton used for sewing.
Knot	A fastening made by looping the thread.
Sewing	Make stitches with a needle and thread.
Running stitch	A simple stitch which goes forwards and backwards through the fabric without crossing over.

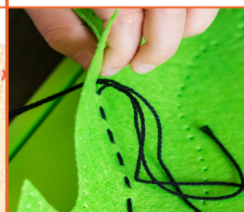
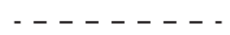

Template	A shaped material used as a pattern.
Cross stitch	A stitch formed when two stitches cross over each other in a cross
Applique	A piece of fabric is sewn onto a larger piece of fabric.
Thread	A thin piece of cotton used for sewing.
Knot	A fastening made by looping the thread.
Sew	Make stitches with a needle and thread.
Secure	To ensure it doesn't move or come apart
Running stitch	A simple stitch which goes forwards and backwards through the fabric without crossing over.

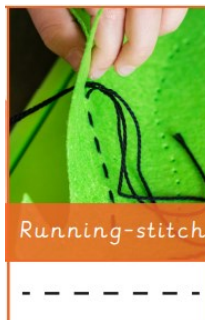
