Most food chains start with a green

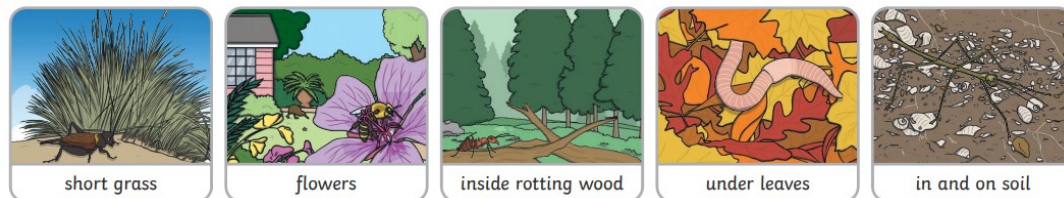
Some things may have 'once lived' but have since died e.g. a plant, animals or dead skin. Other things like rocks, soil, air and plastic have never lived.

Most living things live in habitats to which they are suited and can provide them with the food, shelter, water and space that they need.

A shark is suited to its habitat (ocean) because it has fins to help it swim through the water and it has gills to help it breath under water.

Sticky Vocabulary

food chain	A group of living that depend on each other as a source of food.
habitat	A home for animals, plants and any living things.
microhabitat	A small home for plants, animals and insects. For example under a stone for a woodlouse.
living	All living things move, breathe, grow, make babies, get rid of waste and get their energy from food.
dead	Were once living but now are not.
suited	Fits the need of an animals
shelter	A safe place to be from the weather.
