Christians believe that God created the world in 7 days.




Christians and Jewish people follow the Golden Rule.

Key Learning

Pesach (Passover)

- Celebrated by Jewish people.
- Remembers the time when Jewish people escaped slavery in Egypt. They arrived at the Red Sea and Moses parted the water to let them through.
- They eat from The Seder Plate to remind them of this time.



Christmas

- The day Jesus , the son of God was born in Bethlehem.
- Celebrated on 25th December each year.
- Celebrated by giving presents.
- Special food is eaten.
- There are celebrations in church.

Unit 1.2– who is a Muslim and what do they believe?

In this unit of work we are going to learn in depth from Islam, finding out about Muslim ways of life and beliefs .

Key Learning

Muslims believe that:

- Their god (Allah) is so special that they cannot have any pictures of him.
- They believe that Allah has 99 names.
- Muhammad is a special Muslim leader/prophet. He saw an angel in a cave who told him that he would teach people about God.
- When writing Muhammad they must write PBUH after his name
- When saying the name of Muhammad they must add: Peace be upon him after.
- Muslims celebrate Ramadan and Eid.

Mosque:

- Muslims go to Mosque to pray and be closer to their God.
- Before they pray they have a special washing ceremony called Wudu.
- They kneel on a prayer mat and face Mecca to pray.
- The Imam leads the prayers and reads from the Qu'ran.

Key Learning


The Bible

The Bible is the Christian holy book.

It is written in many languages.

It contains four chapters written by different people.

The Bible has to be kept in a clean and safe place.



The Qu'ran

The Qu'ran is the Muslim holy book.

It is written in Arabic.

Muslims have to wash before touching it.

It must be kept high up on a stand and is covered in white cloth.

The teachings of Muhammad (PBUH) are in the Qu'ran.



The Torah

The Torah Scrolls are the Jewish holy scriptures.

They are read right to left with a yad and are written in Hebrew.

The scrolls are kept in a special cupboard called the Ark.

They contain the teachings of Moses.
