## The Roman Empire

Key Learning

Around 2,000 years ago, the city of Rome was at the centre of a huge empire. Rome ruled over 45 million people across the world.

The Romans attempted to invade Britain 3 times. They wanted the precious metals found here. Julius Caesar first invaded in 55BC and 54 BC. Finally, nearly 100 years later, in 43AD Emperor Claudius started to successfully take over Britain.



The Celts who were living in Britain at the time were not happy that the Romans were taking over. In AD60, Queen Boudicca got together an army to fight the Romans. She burnt down Roman towns including London.

The Romans had one of the largest, most powerful armies in the world. They had the best weapons and armour. At one point the Roman army had over half a million soldiers. To keep track of this they were split into groups called legions.





Wealthy Romans lived in Villa's some of which were kept warm with underfloor heating. Aqueducts were built to bring water to the city. The Romans also built forts and walls to protect their towns and cities and built straight roads to enable the army to move guickly around the country. There are lots of remains of the Romans which help us to see what life was like then:
